

Camp Prices and Cancellation Policy for 2014

This posting is to inform our campers of price changes that go into effect starting with the 2014 Michigan Dog Scout Camps. While the base registration fee has gone up, please note that our repeat campers who pay their balances in a timely manner will NOT see a rate change.

New Rate: \$750 full camp fee for one person and one dog – includes all activities and instruction, 3 meals and snack daily (\$400 additional family member)

Repeat Camper Discount: \$100 off full camp fee, \$50 off additional camper fee. For those campers who have attended a previous MI Dog Scout Camp.

Early Bird Discount: \$100 off full camp fee, \$50 off additional camper fee for those campers who pay the balance of camp registration fees in full no later than the:

- For June camps: full payment received no later than April 1
- For July camps: full payment received no later than May 1st

Campers MAY qualify for BOTH discounts, as applicable.

Camp Payment Cancellation Policy

Cancellation prior to 60 days before the first day of camp	Full refund minus the non-refundable deposit. *
Cancellation between 59 days and 30 days before the first day of camp	Half the amount paid- not including the deposit. <i>Note: If you can find someone to take your place, you can get a full refund (minus the deposit) once your replacement pays in full.</i>
Cancellation within 30 days of camp	No refunds/no carry over. *

** DSA Board of Directors reserves the right to make exceptions to this policy on an individual basis*

DSA makes several decisions based on the number of people that enroll in camp including staffing, activities and whether there are enough attendees to hold the camp or not. Most of these decisions are based on projected income. By the 90 day mark, we have most of the major decisions made, have booked specialty instructors, have bought what is needed for certain activities, have hired staff, etc. The more early sign-ups we have, the more stuff we can plan. But cancellations within 90 days without finding a replacement to take your spot can really disrupt the plans.
