

Dog Scouts of America Merit Badge Check-Off Sheet

Sledding

Items **bolded** below are requirements that must be demonstrated to the Evaluator. Non-bolded items are training steps that may be introduced in class and are helpful for achieving the requirements. All behaviors must have been taught or re-taught to the dog (preferably using a new cue), using only positive reward-based methods.

Handler knows and can describe the equipment required for safe participation in this sport
Handler knows proper safety for this sport and exercises caution for the safety of him/herself and others, and his/her own dog and other dogs who may be participating
Handler knows the rule of 120 and follows it to keep the dog safe
Handler can describe how to properly maintain the dog in good condition for the sport
Handler can properly put on and take off a sledding harness
Dog will stand willingness to be harnessed and will wear it without showing any fear
Dog does not show fear of the sled
Dog will pull a tire or other weight without fear
Dog will pull the sled or wheeled rig while being called by the handler
Dog will pull the sled or wheeled rig with the handler onboard
Handler knows the necessary sled dog cues, including 'gee', 'haw', 'on-by', 'hike' and 'whoa', and knows how to teach these to the dog
Dog will run with other dogs without showing any signs of aggression
Dog will pull the sled or wheeled rig without slack in the tug line
Dog will pull the sled or wheeled rig 3 miles as a part of a team of dogs (at least one other dog)
