

DSA Camp Rules

- 1. Campers must be fully informed prior to coming to camp by reviewing all camp information provided for their benefit on the web site.
- 2. Campers agree to abide by all safety and security rules when participating in both structured and social activities, including all provisions put in place to combat the spread of COVID-19.
- 3. Dogs must be in good physical condition in order to participate in camp activities and must not have been exposed to any communicable diseases within 30 days prior to arriving at camp.
- 4. Camp is a community environment and campers must work together in a supportive and friendly manner.
- 5. Clean up after your self and your dogs on trails and in buildings, including in your room or cabin. Put things away where they belong and report anything that is damaged while you are using it. Campers are responsible for any damage caused by their dogs.
- 6. Campers must attend the Orientation & Safety sessions for any activity they participate in and must attend instructional sessions in order to check out for any badge.
- 7. No disrespectful behavior will be tolerated, including excessive use of alcohol, foul or offensive language and/or subversive behavior.
- 8. Smoking is prohibited in all camp buildings and is allowed in approved areas only. Keep smoke away from doorways and windows and use provided receptacles for cigarette butts.
- 9. All campers must be 18 years or older OR must be under the supervision of a guardian at all times.
- 10. Camp staff is here to ensure that camp is a safe and fun place to be. Staff members have the right, individually or collectively to make decisions regarding safety, camp property and camp attendees. Staff may refuse entry to campers and/or may remove campers from an activity if necessary. The camp director may dismiss any camper from camp with cause, with no refunds issued.
