

## Dog Scouts of America Merit Badge Check-Off Sheet

Parkour 1

Items **bolded** below are requirements that must be demonstrated to the Evaluator. Non-bolded items are training steps that may be introduced in class and are helpful for achieving the requirements. All behaviors must have been taught or re-taught to the dog (preferably using a new cue), using only positive reward-based methods.

Handler must understand all safety protocols and ensure the safety of the dog at times
Dog must wear a non-restrictive harness while doing parkour and remain on a 4-6 foot leash,
Dog must approach an obstacle that is at least the shoulder height of the dog and place 2 front feet onto the obstacle; Dog must remain on the obstacle for at least 5 seconds
Dog must jump up and place all 4 feet on 3 different obstacles and remain in on the obstacle for at least 5 seconds; at least one obstacle must be equal to the dog's shoulder height at a minimum
Dog must walk or jump into an obstacle that has 4 sides measuring less than the length of the dog (nose to base of tail), like a box or laundry basket; dog must keep 4 paws in the obstacle for at least 5 seconds
Dog must go around an obstacle that is at least 3 feet away from the handler and makes a 180 degree turn back towards the handler
Dog will back up at least 3 steps on flat ground
Dog will back up at least 5 feet stepping onto an obstacle that is at least hock height, without sitting down in the process
Dog and handler will demonstrate sequencing, where the dog performs at least 3 parkour behaviors in a row using a different obstacle for each behavior; the sequence should flow, should not require excessive extra cues and the dog may not hesitate in moving from one obstacle to another
Dog and handler will demonstrate creativity by demonstrating 3 different parkour behaviors using the same obstacle
Dog must demonstrate stimulus control by differentiating between the cue to get up on and the cue to go under using the same obstacle
Dog must jump over one obstacle that is at least elbow height, where the surface is different on either side of the obstacle, without touching the obstacle
Handler must send the dog to a raised object that is at least 5 feet away; dog must get up on the object with 4 paws and remain there for at least 5 seconds
