
















## Scout Scoop & Troop Tales

Tachi is pleased that Grandma (Evelyn) has started participating in some of our troop meetings as he now has more opportunities to earn treats while I watch and help other members.





Some of our dogs were in this kind of environment for the first time and they all did great, even with a lot of noise and commotion in the building.




















#### Troop 217—MI (cont.)
