

## Dog Scouts of America Merit Badge Check-Off Sheet

**Copy Cat** 

Items **bolded** below are requirements that must be demonstrated to the Evaluator. Non-bolded items are training steps that may be introduced in class and are helpful for achieving the requirements. All behaviors must have been taught or re-taught to the dog (preferably using a new cue), using only positive reward-based methods.

Handler can teach the dog simple behaviors using positive shaping methods
Handler understands the 'old cue' to 'new cue' transition
Handler can effectively help the dog transition from an old cue to a new one
Handler understands and can explain the concept of social learning and how it differs from shaping
Handler can describe the protocol for facilitating social learning
Handler can explain how social learning can be used to teach the dog 3 helpful tasks
Dog can demonstrate 3 behaviors on verbal cue ONLY, with no handler body movement
Dog/handler team can demonstrate 3 known behaviors using the 'Do It' protocol. This means – the dog copies the behaviors with NO other cues (verbal, head bob, eye flick, pinkie wiggle, etc.)
Dog/handler team can demonstrate 2 NEVER BEFORE INTRODUCED behaviors using the 'Do It' protocol. This means – the first time the dog attempts the behaviors is in front of the evaluator during badge check off
Dog/handler team can demonstrate a total of 5 behaviors using the 'Do It' protocol (3 known behaviors and 2 never before introduced)
