

Items **bolded** below are requirements that must be demonstrated to the Evaluator. Non-bolded items are training steps that may be introduced in class and are helpful for achieving the requirements. All behaviors must have been taught or re-taught to the dog (preferably using a new cue), using only positive reward-based methods.

Handler understands how to use back chaining to teach the dog to target while using multiple targets
Handler and dog can perform a random pattern with targets at gradually increasing distances
Dog will go away from handler on cue
Dog will readily get up on the target platform
Dog will sit, stand or down on the target until the next cue is given, or for at least 5 seconds
Dog knows a "hup" or "get up" onto a target such as a low table or platform
Dog demonstrates the "sit", "down", "stay" and "come" cues while completing the exercise
 Dog can be directed in a random pattern between targets spaced 25' apart on the diagonal Dog demonstrates a "go out" from the center target to the 2nd base target From the 2nd base target the dog is always directed to move to the middle target

- Dog moves as directed from side to side between the middle target and the 1st and 3rd base targets
- Exercise ends with a recall to handler
