	Band-Aids in several sizes, including "butterfly" bandages
	<u>Vet Wrap</u>
	Large Gauze Pads – individually wrapped non-stick and sterile
	Sharp Scissors with small blades
	Antibacterial Wound Wash
	Antibacterial Ointment
	<u>Hydrocortisone</u> anti-itch <u>ointment or gel</u>
	Benadryl or other antihistamine for allergic reactions; no ingredients other than antihistamines
	<u>Gas-x</u> for bloat
	<u>Disposable Rubber Gloves</u>
	Adjustable Velcro Muzzle in several sizes
	Rectal or In Ear <u>Thermometer</u>
	Blanket to use for transporting or covering a dog

	OTC Pain Killers for humans
	Epi Pen for serious human allergic reactions
	Breathing Barrier with one-way valve for human CPR
	Space Blanket for warmth if in shock

	Bandana kept in a Ziplock bag to keep it clean
	Styptic Pen or Powder for minor bleeding
	Snake Bite Kit
